and to the social care sector – this year, for every £1 invested in Forward Carers, we saved the social care sector £11.67!



Ageing Better in Birmingham

Ageing Better in Birmingham, funded by The National Lottery Community Fund, is a programme to bring together the Birmingham community and help those over 50 years to overcome isolation.

Over the past seven years, the Ageing Better Fund has supported citizens of all ages to empower people over 50 to make contributions to their community, by starting Ageing Better Groups. The Fund offers grants of up to £2,000 to empower people to set up groups and activities that help end isolation for older people. In 2021, As a result of the impact of Covid–19 and due to our previous fantastic work supporting residents, the Ageing Better Fund was extended by one year to help people reconnect after such a difficult period.

The groups were as unique as the people who attended them, ranging from lunch clubs, exercise classes, craft sessions, workshops, memory making groups, knitting (pictured right), and much more – but they all had one common theme, attendees came together to smile and make lasting memories.



The Ageing Better Fund in Action: The Welcome Table

A group of churchgoing friends from the Erdington area who had been unable to get out since the pandemic were thrilled to access Ageing Better funding to hold the lovely-named The Welcome Table, an online virtual lunch club. Their funding allowed them to have a facilitator to lead fun and engaging activity sessions on exercise, singing, storytelling and more.

Many of the members were initially supported to get online by friends and family members as meeting online in the virtual world was a completely new experience. A happy side-effect was that friends and family stayed for the sessions, reuniting families online and bringing much happiness to all. Many of the Welcome Table attendees are housebound or find it difficult to travel, so moving to online meetings has removed some of the barriers to joining and the groups intends to remain online, empowering attendees to continue experiencing the benefits of fun, social activities together.

Forward Carers CIC manages the Birmingham Carers Hub partnership. Together we provide information, advice, support and wellbeing services to Carers across Birmingham, so that families stay healthier and happier together, for longer.

Specialist Support for Carers

We commission specialist Carer projects that address gaps in support for Carers across Birmingham. In 2021, we invested £300,000 to fund 16 new Carer projects. As a result, hundreds of unpaid Carers of all ages received services that met their needs and helped them manage the difficulties caused by the Pandemic.
